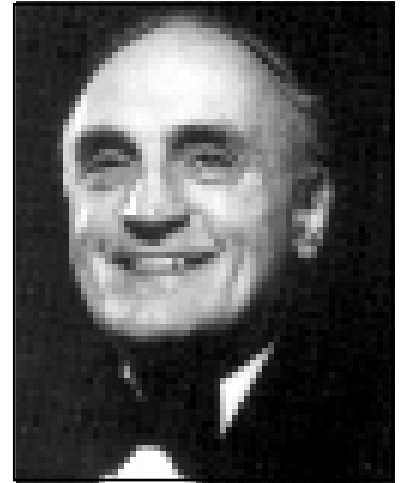
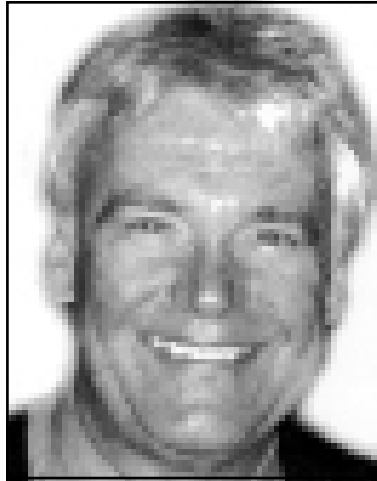

## STRONG LEADERSHIP CONTINUES...

In the history of the Manitoba Sports Hall of Fame & Museum since its inception in 1980, there has been no shortage of quality people who have assumed the leadership of the volunteer Board of Directors. Founding Chairman Jim Trifunov led the organization through its formative years from 1980-93. Jim was gravely ill when we opened our first museum facility in 1993 in the Johnston Terminal at The Forks. He did, however, cut the ceremonial ribbon

from his wheelchair at the Grand Opening before his passing five days later. It was the realization of a long sought-after dream for Jim and his volunteers.

In 1993, R.A. "Sam" Fabro assumed the Chair. Involved since the early '80's on the Board, Sam was instrumental in closing the deal at The Forks and, when finances dictated a move, re-locating and expanding the museum facility to the 5<sup>th</sup> Floor of the Bay Downtown in the old Georgian Room Restaurant.

The year 2000 saw the reins of leadership (now President, instead of Chairman) pass to Jim Hedley. The charismatic lawyer steered the organization through the onset of the new millenium with improvements to the new facility at the Bay and an emphasis on the Athletes, Builders

and Teams that make up the Hall of Fame itself. Jim's legacy to the organization lay in a new model of governance where the Board set policy and the staff and committees were empowered to implement it. An upgrade in professional staff, both at the office and museum, and the recruitment of key volunteers also testify to Jim's leadership.

In June, 2002, the reins of the Presidency pass over to Harry Ethans (Senior V.P. Media Integration for CanWest Global). Harry served on the Board for a six-year term (1994-2000) as Fundraising Chair and founded such successful events as the Annual Stanley Cup Nite and the Casino Fun Nite. Well-known in the business community, Harry's love for sport and its history is equal to his predecessors. The Manitoba Sports Hall of Fame & Museum is in good hands.

## MEMBER NOTES

⇒ 1980 Inductee **Judy Moss** passed away on October 6<sup>th</sup>, 2001 at the age of 85. The 1934 British Empire Games Gold Medallist in diving was the last surviving member of the inaugural induction class of '80.

⇒ On March 19<sup>th</sup>, 2002, Premier Gary Doer and Sport Minister Ron Lemieux, assisted by 2002 Olympic Gold Medallist Jen Botterill (Hockey), unveiled a mural dedicated to the 1920 Olympic Gold Medallist **Winnipeg Falcons Hockey Team** ('80) in the rotunda of the Provincial Legislative. The United Icelandic Appeal commissioned local artist Luther Pokrant to paint it. The mural will be housed in the new Museum facility in Gimli after its run at the Legislature.

⇒ 1981 Inductee **Leible Hershfield** was inducted posthumously into the inaugural class of the Manitoba Softball Hall of Fame on May 25<sup>th</sup>, 2002. Other Manitoba Sports Hall of Fame Honoured Members on the slate included: **Olive (Bend) Little** ('85), **John & Stan Shaley** ('92), **Bea (Hall) McKenzie** ('94), **Gerry Howard** ('96), and **Jim Adams** ('98). Also recognized in the team category were the 1967-68 **Molson Canadians** ('91) and the 1965 **C.U.A.C. Blues** ('92).

⇒ 1995 Inductee **Doreen Botterill**, a speed skater in the 1964 and 1968 Olympics, was proud to see her daughter Jennifer capture Gold in the 2002 Salt Lake City Games. Other Manitoban medallists included Sami Jo Small (Gold – Women's Hockey), Ed Belfour (Gold – Men's Hockey), Saskatchewan-born, Russell, Manitoba-raised Theo Fleury (Gold – Men's Hockey), Cindy Klassen (Bronze – Women's speed skating) and Clara Hughes (Bronze – Women's Speed Skating) who became the first Canadian to medal in both the summer (Bronze in Cycling 1996) and Winter Olympics. Way to go Clara and Manitoba!

## WHAT'S ON DISPLAY AT THE BAY?



*Olympic Exhibit at The Bay*

A brand new exhibit that celebrates both the past and the present! "ON THE ICE" ANTWERP TO SALT LAKE CITY" is a salute to Manitoba's Winter Olympians. The display begins with Frank Frederickson's gold medal for the Winnipeg Falcons in 1920 at the Olympic Games in Antwerp. Although the first Winter Olympics were retroactively designated to begin with the 1924 Games in Chamonix, France, the Falcons captured the first Olympic hockey gold medal four years earlier. The 1932 Winnipeg captured hockey gold in Lake Placid and the Canadian Men's and Women's teams won in Salt Lake City in 2002. Manitoba born Jennifer Botterill, Sami Jo Small and Ed Belfour and Russell-raised Theo Fleury received gold medals. There is plenty to see for the Olympic hockey fan in this exhibit.

Speed skating is well represented too with bronze medallists Frank Stack (1932) and Gord Audley (1952). Also featured are Olympians Doreen (McCannell) Botterill (1964 & 1968), Bob Boucher (1968), Sylvia Burka (1976) and Liz (Appleby) Levin (1976). Future Hall of Famers Susan Auch (1988, 1992, 1994, 1998 and 2002), Clara Hughes (2002) and Cindy Klassen (2002).

Lyndon Johnson (1984 & 1988) represents figure skating's contribution

to the exhibit. The display will run over the summer and is a colorful tribute that Manitobans can be proud of.
